The Comfortable Home Rebates Program provides rebates and incentives to help you:

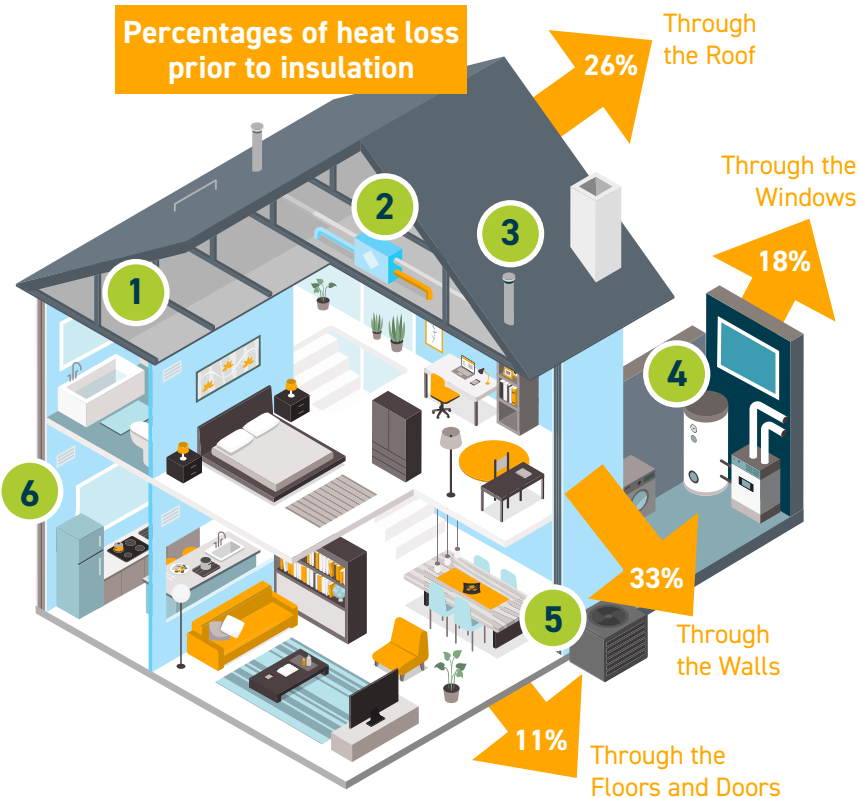

Top 3 ways to increase comfort and save money

For most homes, the best ways to make your home more comfortable, all while spending less on heating and cooling costs, include:

1. Insulating and air sealing to reduce air leaks
2. Replacing old heating and cooling systems with high-efficiency ones
3. Replacing or sealing old, leaking duct systems

- 1 Insulating maintains the indoor air temperature, keeping you cool in the summer and warm in the winter.
- 2 The correct size air return will maximize the efficiency of your heating and cooling system.
- 3 Inefficiently designed ducts or leaking ducts cost you money and energy.
- 4 Heat pump water heaters use less than half the energy of standard electric water heaters.
- 5 Old inefficient air conditioners can cost you money and energy.
- 6 Air sealing keeps the warm and cool air in your living space, where you want it.



How the program works

Designed to help you save money and stay comfortable, the Comfortable Home Rebates Program provides rebates when you work with a Participating Contractor to make qualifying home improvements. Here are the steps to saving:

1. You work with a Participating Contractor or an independent building analyst to develop a project plan and budget that's tailored to your home. (Please note that the contractor must be licensed for the type of work undertaken.)
2. You authorize a Participating Contractor to complete the work.
3. Your Participating Contractor or independent building analyst completes the program application and submits it for processing.

Rate eligibility

To qualify for this program, you must:

- Have electricity or natural gas distributed by PG&E to the service address (rebates are only available for fuels provided by PG&E)
- Live in a detached, single-family residence or 2-4-unit complex
- Have lived in the home for at least 12 months
- Plan to stay in the home for at least the next two (2) years
- Have not participated in any ratepayer-funded energy-saving program in the past 12 months, such as ESA (Energy Savings Assistance)

Please note, customers living in the nine Bay Area counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, Sonoma) should work with BayREN's Home+ program.
