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See How Energy Efficiency Can Benefit You at Tax Time

Tax season is here: the perfect time to reflect on the previous year and look ahead to the new. Did you know that you can receive tax credits for certain energy efficiency improvements or purchases you made in 2022? It's true! Check with your tax professional to see if you qualify.

Even better, thanks to the new Inflation Reduction Act, additional tax credits are becoming available for 2023. That makes now the perfect time to kickstart those home energy efficiency projects. Don't pass up this opportunity to reduce your energy use, lower your bills, and earn credits next tax season too!

Here are just a few of the key tax credits and rebates* to look for:



- **Up to a \$2,000 tax credit** for qualifying home efficiency projects, which includes \$500 for doors, \$600 for windows and skylights, and \$2,000 for heat pumps



- **30% income tax credit** on clean energy equipment, such as rooftop solar, wind energy, geothermal heat pumps, and more.



- **Up to a \$7,500 credit** for new and \$4,000 for used EV purchases. Income caps and price limits apply.



- **Rebates of up to \$8,000** for energy efficiency retrofits like insulation and HVAC (depending on measure installed and household income).



- **Rebates of up to \$14,000** for electric appliances, including up to \$1,750 for a heat pump water heater; \$8,000 for a heat pump for space heating or cooling; and \$840 for an electric stove or an electric heat pump clothes dryer.

Opportunities are still developing.
